Day 1

Welcome and Opening:

- John Bones and Matthew Justice, MPAC Co-Chairs, welcomed the group on behalf of the North Vancouver Island Technical Team and the Marine Working Group Committee.
- Introductions were made around the table (including alternates, staff and observers).
- John reviewed agenda and purpose of the meeting.

Items Discussed and Clarified:

- 1. A facilitator will attend future NVI MPAC meetings to manage conversations and advice on draft spatial designations and draft versions of the NVI Plan.
- 2. Use of "final" in C&T and IOS document filenames indicates final draft. These documents will be incorporated into the draft Plan and so formats and titles may be amended.

Planning Updates and Advice Review:

- Matthew reviewed the MPAC membership list.
- John reported on the meeting summary for MPAC#3, and reiterated the purpose of the summary.
- John/Matthew reported on new studies/contracts underway by consultants for MaPP: review of
 marine infrastructure; oil spill response times; Implementation Financing contract; Decision Support
 Tool contract; upcoming work on EBM Indicators.
- John reported on the Regional Monitoring and Enforcement Framework being developed by MaPP.
- Matthew reported on the first RMAC meeting, December 10, in Richmond and the next RMAC meeting to be held March 4, in Richmond.
- MPAC members reported on activities in their sectors, their workload related to MaPP, and other relevant issues.

Items Discussed and Clarified:

- 1. The C&T and IOS documents are not being updated right away, but advice received from stakeholders will be considered and reflected when these drafts are incorporated into a draft Plan.
- 2. Clarification that Sub-regional MPACs will have an opportunity to review and comment on Indicators being developed at the regional level.
- 3. Clarification that the RMAC does work of regional scope, addressing topics not addressed in sub-regional plans, and does not evaluate the sub-regional plans.
- 4. Sectors can make a request to Nanwakolas Council to view the Ha-ma-yas plan and /or meet with Nanwakolas staff to discuss this First Nations' plan, which is a basis for Nanwakolas input to the joint planning work.

Review & Discussion of New Draft Material:

Aquaculture

- Matthew reviewed the C&T document, and comments were received from stakeholders
- Bill reviewed the Strategies document, and comments were received from stakeholders.

Items Discussed and Clarified:

- 1. Comments on the C&T document included: corrections to maps; clarification on tenure applications; timeframes for statistical analysis; Cohen Report; marine plant aquaculture (mariculture) activities; legislative transition in aquaculture industries.
- 2. Technical Team to refine presentation of data on aquaculture for plan development.
- 3. Technical Team to include relevant information from Cohen Report when drafting the Plan.
- 4. Comments on the Strategies document included: compatibility of clam gardens and recreation; impacts of aquaculture; clarification that assessing conflicting uses is part of environmental assessment processes; Cohen recommendations; cumulative effects; sustainability certification programs; collaboration among sectors; differentiation of two aquaculture sectors; mariculture.
- 5. Clarification that bilateral discussions among stakeholders are encouraged, especially for Plan review purposes.
- 6. Technical Team to address provisions for resolving conflicts, and will revise strategies accordingly.
- 7. See advice log for specific advice given regarding aquaculture documents.

Log Handling

- Jillian reviewed the C&T document, and comments were received from stakeholders.
- Scott reviewed the Strategies document, and comments were received from stakeholders.

Items Discussed and Clarified:

- 1. Comments on the C&T document included: clarification that earlier feedback on this document will be considered; and two maps are being produced by Forestry.
- 2. Bruce to provide maps to Technical Team.

- 3. Comments on the Strategies document included: commercial fisheries and log dumps; local benefit/employment; terminology; DFO assessment process; heli-drops and impacts; remediation of areas of high biodiversity or that include species of concern; reactivation of old sites; active vs. inactive sites; underwater debris; shared use.
- 4. Jacob to provide information on acoustic studies.
- 5. See advice log for specific advice given regarding marine pollution documents.

Energy

- Jillian reviewed the C&T document, and comments were received from stakeholders.
- Bill reviewed Strategies document, and comments were received from stakeholders.

Items Discussed and Clarified:

- 1. Comments on the C&T document included: need to include more recent data; clarification that document addresses offshore wind; costs of offshore power; BC Energy Plan; transmission access; public vs. private lines; tidal energy proponents; local government zoning; EA process; seabird colonies at the north end of Vancouver Island.
- 2. Ellen to send written comments.
- 3. Comments on the Strategies document included: terminology -stakeholders rather than local community; local government; terrestrial components; key species; diesel dependent communities and renewable energy development; proactive strategies; conservation of energy.

Infrastructure

- John reviewed the C&T document, and comments were received from stakeholders.
- Scott reviewed the Strategies document, and comments were received from stakeholders.

Items Discussed and Clarified:

- 1. Feedback received regarding request from consultant (Hemmera) to stakeholders re: marine infrastructure contract.
- 2. Co-leads to contact Science Coordinator over concerns with request by consultant.
- 3. General comments on the Strategies document included: definition of *infrastructure*; private and public infrastructure; overlap with marine pollution paper; shellfish aquaculture inspection; availability of fuel on the coast; terminology; zoning.

Marine Research and Education

Comments made on Strategies document included: education; sub-regional consistency; hands-on training; citizen science; research undertaken at alternative "stations"; climate change impacts on SARA-listed species; local government; inventory of research done or underway; adaptive management related to tenure allocation; training in communities; educational programs.
- 5. Technical Team to develop a research inventory.
