Day 1

Welcome and Opening:

- John Bones and Matthew Justice welcomed the group on behalf of the North Vancouver Island Technical Team.
- Merv Child welcomed the group on behalf of the Marine Working Group Committee, acknowledging
 the meeting as a milestone for the draft NVI sub-regional marine plan, and thanking everyone for
 their hard work. He noted that the draft plan still requires vetting through higher levels of
 government.
- Introductions were made around the table (including alternates, staff and observers).
- Matthew reviewed agenda and purpose of the meeting.

Advice Review and Updates:

• John reviewed the MPAC membership list. Jamie Scarrow was introduced as the MaPP Commercial Tourism coordinator.

- Matthew provided an overview of the meeting summary for MPAC#5.
- John reported on updates to the advice log, indicating it has been split into two logs: one recording advice on the background Current Conditions and Trends information, and the other recording advice on the draft marine plan document contents.
- Jo provided an update on MaPP outputs and contracts underway, focusing on: Marine Planning Portal; Regional planning tools Zoning Framework, Vulnerability Matrix, Compatibility Matrix, Indicators for Implementation and Monitoring; Climate Change Risk and Adaptation; Infrastructure.
- Matthew reported on RMAC updates and that next meeting will be in October, 2013.
- John highlighted possible modifications to the MaPP timeline to approximately March 2014.
- John described expectations for the September 9 MPAC in Port McNeill and September 10 field trip.
- John indicated open houses will likely be scheduled in communities in October, in consultation with local government reps.
- MPAC members reported on activities in their sectors, activities and challenges related to information sharing with their sectors, and other relevant issues.

Items Discussed and Clarified:

- 1. Bruce to share new forestry maps and data sets within a week.
- 2. Jacob is moving to another job and will train a replacement who will attend the next MPAC meeting.
- 3. Suggestion for MaPP to make presentations to Regional Districts when plan is nearer completion.
- 4. Sector reps to advise Technical Team of willingness to remain involved in process until March 2014.
- 5. See advice log regarding additional and more specific comments.

Review & Discussion: Plan Table of Contents

Overview

• John presented a high level overview of the Plan table of contents.

Chapter synopsis, highlights, gaps, changes

- Matthew provided details on "front matter" and Chapter 1.
- Jillian provided an overview of content of Chapters 2 and 3.
- Scott provided highlights of Chapters 4 and 5.
- John provided highlights of Chapter 6 and 7.

Items Discussed and Clarified:

- 1. Parts of Chapter 2 will end up in a separate document which may be an appendix to the final plan.
- 2. An executive summary (or separate summary plan) will likely be produced.
- 3. The PNCIMA EBM vision & goal language may be included in front matter and / or Chapter 4.
- 4. Clarification provided about which First Nations are part of Nanwakolas Council, and discussion of shared and core territories.
- 5. Clarification about how advice about the vision was incorporated.
- 6. Clarification of chapter 6 plan review and appeals; and the Implementation Monitoring Committee would be comprised of the same MPAC sectors.
- 7. Request for stakeholder input to populate the plan assessment table.
- 8. MaPP is pursuing funding options for implementation as part of planning phase.
- 9. See advice log for specific advice given regarding plan table of contents and chapter text.

Lunch

Review & Discussion: Objectives and Strategies

Draft plan objectives and strategies: highlights, changes, gaps

- Jillian presented Community & Economy, Marine Infrastructure, Marine Pollution.
- Scott presented Conservation & Protection, Cultural and Heritage Resources, Marine Recreation and Tourism.
- John presented Log Handling & Storage, Aquaculture, Energy, Fisheries.
- Matthew presented Governance & Collaborative Management, Regulatory Compliance & Enforcement, Research and Education.

Items Discussed and Clarified:

- 1. The report on regional marine pollution prepared by consultants for MaPP will be made available to RMAC and MPAC members and alternates in Dropbox.
- 2. Clarification that time and space conflicts are addressed in zoning designations, rather than in strategies.
- 3. Clarification that capability and suitability issues are addressed in zoning designations.
- 4. Strategies related to shellfish aquaculture and finfish aquaculture will continue to be located in one Aquaculture section, but strategies for each could be lumped separately.
- 5. Discussion about distinguishing between guided recreational fishing and self-guided recreational fishing, and nesting recreational fishing under tourism.
- 6. Clarification that run-of-river energy projects and on-land wind farms are not addressed in the marine plan.
- 7. Clarification that a final draft plan will be circulated to all interested stakeholders for comment, even if they are not participating in MaPP.
- 8. See advice log for specific advice given regarding zoning uses and activities, and definitions of uses and activities documents.

Review & Discussion: Area Specific Management Direction

Overview of the area specific management direction; highlights, supporting tables; advice used

- John presented the proposed zoning approach and general management statements.
- Matthew presented the accompanying tables: recommended activities and uses; descriptions of activities and uses; capability and suitability; advice used.

Items Discussed and Clarified:

- 1. Discussion about clear intent in zones (e.g., economic development, conservation), and IUCN categories, and the need for clear descriptions.
- 2. Discussion about review of finfish aquaculture tenure applications.
- 3. Discussion about inclusion of Cohen report recommendations in the plan; and clarification that work is being done to review Cohen Report recommendations for inclusion in the draft plan.
- 4. See advice log for specific advice given regarding the area specific management direction and tables.

Overview of Zones and Planning

 Scott provided an overview of draft maps; area map; identified zones; SMZs, planning units; and application of IUCN categories.

Items Discussed and Clarified:

- 1. Clarified intention of "Conditional statements"
- 2. Clarified general management statements, and how apply to all zones.
- 3. Clarification of how will use "Recommended Uses and Activities" table for management direction and intent in PMZ, and will assign IUCN category which will give an additional level of direction.
- 4. Discussion of process how creating sub-zones from "Planning Units"
- 5. See advice log for specific advice given zones and planning.

Review & Discussion: Zoning Maps

Approach & methodology to maps, Boundaries, Discussion on Maps

- Greg presented the approach and methodology (steps used to develop the maps).
- Scott described planning units.

Items Discussed and Clarified:

- 1. Preliminary zoning reflects efforts to reconcile the existing Ha-ma-yas and BC Coastal Plans. Other data layers have not yet been included, e.g., Marxan data.
- 2. Discussion on definitions of "Recommended" and "Conditional" in the Special Management Zone, and intent of the terms in the table, and the expectations the terms set up for tenure applicants.
- 3. Request for sectors to identify conditions/provisions that are important for them, for consideration for inclusion into the table.
- 4. Clarification that a compatibility matrix will be presented as an appendix to the plan.
- 5. Clarification about the level of scale and detail in the marine plan.
- 6. Discussion about acknowledging that activities under federal jurisdiction occur within the plan area.
- 7. Clarification about how finfish aquaculture is addressed in the plan.
- 8. See advice log for specific advice given regarding the approach to preliminary zoning.

Marine Spatial Planning Tool (SeaSketch)

Presentation of the marine spatial planning tool

- Matthew described purpose of the marine spatial planning tool provide zoning recommendations.
- Jo demonstrated the marine spatial planning tool.

Items Discussed and Clarified:

- 1. Request for MPAC to advise if community names are missing from MSP tool data.
- 2. Clarification that the SeaSketch tool belongs to University of California Santa Barbara and MaPP has a license to use SeaSketch for 5 years; after that the MaPP Implementation body will decide on the future of the tool and data.
- 3. Clarification that MPAC members and alternates can see proprietary layers, but not public users.
- 4. MPAC will receive usernames and passwords in mid-June. Usernames and passwords are not to be shared. MPAC can demonstrate the marine spatial planning tool to their constituents, not to the public (because of proprietary data layers).
- 5. GIS contractor (Coastal Resources Mapping) is scheduled to update tenure layer every 2 weeks.
- 6. See advice log for specific advice given regarding the marine spatial planning tool.

Review & Discussion: Roundtable discussions

General discussion and input from stakeholders

Items Discussed and Clarified:

- Comments included: recommended changes to maps; add objectives addressing the impacts of users on protected areas; add objectives addressing temporal conflicts; improved language for describing upland areas; clarification about changes in Nanwakolas Council membership; need for more distinction between types of zones; improved format for tables;
- 2. See advice log for specific advice given regarding the data overlay exercise.

- John summarized the topics covered both days.
- Stakeholder feedback on the plan and recommended zoning deadline has been extended to the third week of July. The NVI Team then has 1 month to incorporate comments before distributing a second draft of the preliminary plan.

- NVI Team will continue to incorporate advice from the Advice Log into Chapter 2 (or relevant document/chapter).
- MaPP will send out instructions on accessing the marine spatial planning tool anticipate mid-June.
