## Day 1

## **Welcome and Opening**

John Bones and Andy Witt welcomed the group on behalf of the NVI Technical Team. Introductions were made around the table.

## **Previous Meeting & Meeting Agenda**

Andy reviewed the agenda and purpose of the meeting and provided a verbal summary of the last MPAC meeting, which focussed on review of the NVI Annual Report and work planning for 2018/19.

## **General Discussion:**

Discussion focused on clarification of statements in the NVI Annual Report.

# **Update on Related Planning Activities**

John Bones provided an update on Federal Ocean initiatives (MPA Network, Ocean Protection Plan).

#### **General Discussion:**

Discussion focused on:

- Reconciliation Framework Agreement (RFA) signed with First Nations on Ocean Protection Plan (OPP) activities in the Northern Shelf Bioregion;
- Complexity of organizing for involvement in Ocean Protection Plan initiatives; B.C.'s involvement in development of the Regional response plan and other initiatives under the OPP including shoreline video surveys, proactive vessel management, and vessels of concern programs;
- Upcoming stakeholder advisory committee meeting on MPA network and timelines including how NVI PMZs are being applied to MPA network planning; and
- Level of consideration of socio-economic values in MPA network planning; and

#### **ACTIONS:**

John to make the RFA available when it is ready for release by Transport Canada.

## **Ongoing Project Updates**

Presentations were made on ongoing NVI Plan projects. These were the **Recreation and Tourism Economic Development** project, the **Tlowitsis Shellfish Aquaculture Pilot Project, Cultural/ Archaeological** projects, and the **Guardian** program.

#### **General Discussion:**

Discussion took place on: recent tourism trends; technical questions related to the shellfish aquaculture project; and protection strategies for vulnerable cultural sites.

#### **ACTIONS:**

- Alex to add the MaPP Strategic Approach flowchart to the MPAC Dropbox.
- MPAC members to provide feedback on Recreation and Tourism recommendations due 2 Nov.
- Josie to provide Bill Wareham with access to the MPAC Dropbox.

## **New Projects**

Presentations were made on ongoing NVI Plan projects. These were the **EBM Monitoring & Kelp Model**, **Polluted Areas Restoration** project, **Communications** projects, and the **Marine Trails** project.

#### **General Discussion:**

General discussion focused on:

- Technical questions related to the monitoring of kelp, eelgrass and oceanographic conditions; clarification that the definition of EBM in the kelp monitoring work plan is the same as was used in the NVI marine plan; the application of the kelp monitoring data to the kelp model;
- The staged approach to EBM indicator monitoring and plans for socio-economic indicator monitoring;
- Justification for areas selected for pollution restoration projects; clarification of how stakeholder feedback on the ESSA report was used.

Alex to send the draft NVI Communications Strategy to the MPAC for feedback by 2 Nov.

## **Anticipated Projects / Year 4 Priorities**

Presentations were made about anticipated projects and Year 4 priorities. These were the **Marine Governance**, **Training Needs**, **Climate Change** and **Kelp Aquaculture** projects.

#### **General Discussion:**

General discussion focused on: the definition of "governance" used by MaPP during plan development; and the scope of MaPP region-wide work on climate change.

# **Plan Monitoring and Review**

A presentation was made on plan monitoring and review.

General discussion focused on recent suggestions to address kelp harvest and changes to definitions of Level 1 and 2 docks; and the process and timeline for plan review.

In a workshop, MPAC members and observers provided feedback on five draft PMZ management plans. These were **Ba'as/Blunden Harbour**, **Nigei Island**, **Cape Caution**, **Burdwood Group**, and **SE Quadra PMZ Management Plans**. Alex captured advice and suggestions within each management plan document as they were raised and discussed. There was a discussion of a potential timeline for feedback and revisions to the PMZ management plans with a goal of completing "final drafts" for December and a potential final review workshop in early 2019, if needed.
